East Palestine Primary Care Clinic Receives \$750,000 for Relocation and Rural Health Clinic Certification

East Palestine’s primary care clinic is set to receive a \$750,000 boost to support its relocation and application for Rural Health Clinic (RHC) certification. The funding was announced by Ohio Governor Mike DeWine and the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) as part of ongoing efforts to support the community following the 2023 train derailment.

The clinic, which is operated by East Liverpool City Hospital, was initially established as a temporary healthcare resource shortly after the Norfolk Southern train derailment. A permanent clinic opened in April 2023, providing essential medical services such as treatment, prescriptions and lab testing to local residents.

The new funding will allow the clinic to move to a new location and apply for RHC certification. As an RHC, the clinic would gain access to additional revenue streams, ensuring its long-term sustainability and continued service to the community.

While a new location for the clinic has not yet been determined, hospital officials are actively exploring options. **Stephanie Conn**, President and CEO of East Liverpool City Hospital, expressed gratitude for the support, stating, “East Liverpool City Hospital’s commitment to the East Palestine community remains unwavering. We strive to provide exceptional healthcare, improve health outcomes and support the well-being of those we serve.”

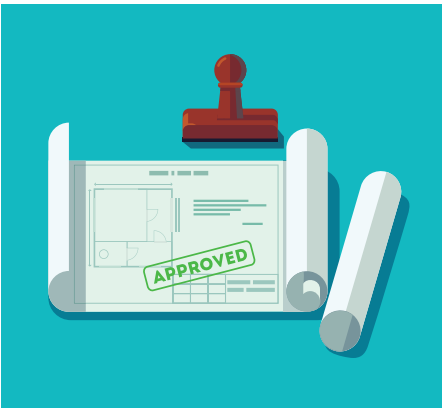
This investment is the latest in a series of initiatives aimed at bolstering healthcare services in East Palestine. In July 2024, the Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services helped establish the East Palestine Resiliency Center, which has since provided mental health and substance use disorder treatment to over 3,500 individuals affected by the derailment.

With continued state support, East Palestine’s healthcare infrastructure is being strengthened to ensure residents have access to necessary medical and mental health services for years to come.

Spring Projects Coming Up?

How to Pull a Permit

As the weather gets warmer, it’s the start of construction season and building projects. Do you know what permits you need? The Village of East Palestine Building and Zoning Department requires a permit for any construction, demolition or remodeling of a commercial building or residence. Contractors who work inside the Village of East Palestine must register and show proof of liability insurance.

Amish Furniture and Home Decor

Rob and Becky Runnion own Runnion's Originals, a cozy shop on OH-14 that sells Amish furniture, home decor, seasonal items, braided rugs, candles and other gifts.

The idea for the store started with Rob's dad, who did woodworking and made cabinets and other furniture. Becky wanted to carry on the tradition and opened a store selling handcrafted items in Industry, Pennsylvania in 2016. Becky is an East Palestine native, and Rob is from West Virginia and recently retired after 34 years in the military, and they decided to move the store to East Palestine in 2019.

Rob jokes, "My role is CEO. But I'm just here to help my wife. She's the brains of the operation. I'm the guy that carries everything out."

The store is family-owned and operated with their daughter-in-law and grandson helping out. The hours are Tuesday through Saturday, 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

"The store started just as a business, but now it's become more than that. It's a way of life," explains Rob. "Friends and neighbors are more like family members. They come in and share stories and we laugh and cry together, cheer each other on and have good times. We give back to the community and support local benevolences, charities and ball teams. If anybody has anything going on in town, we like to help where we can because it's a small town and we stick together."

EP VIP Shopper Club Continues

Chamber of Commerce Plans to Take Over Program Management



The village introduced the EP VIP Shopper Club in September of 2024 with the goal of supporting local businesses and boosting the economy. At the end of three months, we reached out to survey both participating vendors and club members to see what they had to say about the program and if it should continue. Those that responded had a lot of feedback and shared some insightful information.

The 20+ vendors who provided deals were almost unanimous in saying they would like to continue the program and

saw some additional sales they could attribute to the marketing and program advertisements.

While more than 1,000 registered, the biggest takeaway shared was confusion around obtaining a membership card after signing up and disappointment with the number of vendors participating and the discounts offered, which led to many people never actually using the program.

To clarify, membership cards were never mailed to members. The registration confirmation email was supposed to be saved on your cell phone and shown to

a participating vendor and a card picked up in person at the store register the first time you used a discount. Many said they never received that email although they received the survey, which was sent to the same email address given, so we suspect many initial messages went to a spam folder.

Of those that did obtain a card and use it, and replied to the survey, they said they thought the program was worthwhile if it was communicated more clearly, with regular updates on specials and more vendor participation. With that in mind, the offers have been extended and the Chamber of Commerce will soon be taking over the management of the program to continue to expand it and make it worthwhile for both shoppers and businesses alike.

Ohio Lawmakers Push for Health Studies After Train Derailment

U.S. Reps. **Dave Joyce, Marcy Kaptur, Michael Rulli** and **Emilia Sykes** have reintroduced bipartisan legislation to address ongoing health concerns following the 2023 train derailment in East Palestine. The East Palestine Health Impact Monitoring Act of 2025 would fund long-term studies through 2029 on the health effects of the derailment, with a required report to Congress. Similar legislation was introduced in 2024 but did not pass.
