Welcome to East Palestine

New Monument Sign to Begin Construction

The Village of East Palestine is set to receive a brand new welcome sign at the intersection of N. Market Street and SR 14, replacing the current structure. Construction is scheduled to begin in mid- to late April, with an estimated completion time of 90 days. The new sign, funded by Norfolk Southern last year, was delayed due to permitting issues with the Ohio Department of Transportation. The project is being led by contractor Chris Kline of Dynamic Structures.

The design features three 18-foot width sections, each framed by two square piers that reflect the architectural elements of the local high school. A one-foot-high curb will elevate the sign, creating a clean edge for landscaping and easier maintenance.

Additional elements include gravel spaces at the base, two of which will feature flagpoles, while the center area may be landscaped with a shade tree. Ample planting space in front of each sign will enhance its visual appeal, ensuring that the village name and logo remain clearly visible.

This update will serve as a fresh and welcoming entrance to the village that reflects our branding.


The East Palestine Water Department's Annual Consumer Confidence Report Now Available

The East Palestine Water Department's <u>Consumer Confidence Report (CCR) for 2024</u> is now available online on the Water/Sewer Department page of the government website. Copies can also be picked up at the municipal building and the East Palestine Memorial Public Library.

This yearly report required by the Ohio EPA is a snapshot of last year's water quality covering all testing performed between January 1 and December 31, 2024. Included

are details about the Village of East Palestine's source of water, what it contains, and how it compares to standards set by regulatory agencies. Our constant goal is to provide you with a safe and dependable supply of drinking water. We want you to understand the efforts we make to continually improve the water treatment process and protect our water resources.

The Business Toolkit: A Guide for Entrepreneurs

Starting and Growing Your Business in East Palestine, Ohio

The Village of East Palestine, Ohio, is committed to fostering a thriving business community. Whether you're an entrepreneur looking to start a new venture or an established business seeking expansion opportunities, East Palestine offers a wealth of financial programs, economic incentives and resources to support your journey. A new webpage of tools and information is now available on both epohio.org and the village government website to help.

Why Start Your Business in East Palestine?

East Palestine is actively investing in economic development to support local businesses. With a range of financial incentives, forgivable loans and job creation programs, the village provides a business-friendly environment that encourages growth and success.

Financial Assistance for Entrepreneurs

Forgivable Loans for Business Recovery

The Ohio Department of Development has created the East Palestine Emergency Support Program to assist businesses impacted by the February 2023 train derailment. Eligible businesses can receive 0% interest loans ranging from \$10,000 to \$1 million, which are forgivable if used for payroll, rent, utilities, worker protection or inventory replacement.

Gap Financing Programs

For entrepreneurs facing funding shortfalls, East Palestine provides multiple gap financing options:

- SBA 504 Loan: Finance up to 40% of land, building and equipment costs, requiring job creation.
- Regional 166 Loan: Up to 45% of project costs for manufacturing, distribution and technology sectors.
- Revolving Loan Funds: Offered through Valley Partners and OMEGA, these programs provide below-market-rate financing for fixed assets and working capital.

Economic Incentives to Boost Growth

Community Reinvestment Area (CRA) Property Tax Exemptions

The CRA program offers property tax exemptions for new construction, expansions or major renovations. Businesses must apply before construction begins, and exemptions can last up to 15 years.

Job Creation Incentives

Companies in JobsOhio target sectors such as manufacturing, distribution and high-tech industries can access grants, loans, tax credits and training assistance. These incentives require new capital investment and job creation in Ohio.

Bond Financing for Industrial Development

The Columbiana County Port Authority provides industrial development bond financing for eligible projects, offering long-term, fixed-rate financing with possible tax advantages.

Business Support Resources

There are numerous resources available to assist entrepreneurs, including:

- Small Business Development Center (SBDC): Offers counseling, business planning and training.
- Youngstown Business Incubator (YBI): Supports tech startups and entrepreneurs.
- MAGNET & Mahoning Valley
 Manufacturing Coalition: Provides
 manufacturing support and workforce
 development services.

Finding the Right Location

Through partnerships with the Columbiana County Port Authority and ZoomProspector, East Palestine provides an Available Properties Listing for entrepreneurs looking to buy or lease commercial spaces. Property owners can also list their buildings for free.

Permitting and Zoning Requirements

The Village of East Palestine Building and Zoning Department requires permits for construction, demolition or remodeling. Entrepreneurs should ensure compliance with zoning laws before beginning any project. Permit fees vary based on project scope and type.

Community Engagement and Marketing Support

To encourage local business patronage, the village has launched the EP VIP Shopper Club. This free program connects businesses with local shoppers through exclusive deals and discounts, driving foot traffic and customer loyalty.

Jessica A. Oates, LPCC-S, PMH-C, is the owner of Insight Clinical Counseling and Wellness, now with ten offices – five offices in Columbiana County, four in Mahoning County and one in Jefferson County – that employ 130 contractors and employees. They provide individual counseling, couples counseling, group counseling, case management and wellness services. They also offer telehealth services, providing mental health services all across the state.

"The East Palestine location was our fourth office to open in 2020 and the reason that I wanted to open here is that this is my hometown, and these are my roots," Jessica says. "Mental health has always been my passion – to give back to my community. I want this to be a safe place for everyone who walks through the door to work on their struggles and on things that are bothering them. I also want to focus on mental wellness, which includes helping people get where they want to go in life."

area nursing homes and developmental disabilities facilities. This summer, they are launching a sports mental health program, working with teams, coaches and students of all ages on the mental aspect involved around athletics.

Jessica explains, "Our focus here really is on reducing the stigma around mental health. So, if our library asks us to come and do a talk about wellness, we're showing up. If there is an event going on at the school, we'll be there. Insight has grown exponentially in the last five years, and I think that really comes down to our reputation. I think that the best evidence that we have that we are doing really great work is when people are telling other people about how they've responded to therapy and making a referral."

Jessica is very proud of their Insightful Empowerment Scholarship program, which is a scholarship program offered to ten individuals over the course of INSIGHT

Jessica says, "We very much know that when people are picking up the phone to call in for mental health services, sometimes that's not your finest day and that's okay. We hold space for everyone, no matter where they're at in their journey. And we're going to be present for you no matter what that looks like."

Taking your mental health seriously is so important because if you don't take care of your wellness, you are going to be forced to take care of your illness. Anxiety and stress will manifest itself in some way, be it physical ailments, behavioral problems, sleep disturbances, weight gain or loss, etc.

Jessica holds a bachelor's degree in psychology and a master's degree in community clinical mental health counseling, both from Youngstown State University. She prides herself on ensuring her clinicians are highly trained and specialized in the most up-to-date evidence-based modalities available in the mental health field.

Insight Clinical Counseling has clinicians that focus on trauma as well as perinatal mental health, which includes postpartum anxiety, depression, infertility, loss and grief. They also provide mental health services to school districts, including East Palestine, and they offer on site group services for some of the local

This year marks a special milestone in our community's history – the 150th anniversary of the founding of the Village of East Palestine. As we prepare to pay tribute to the East Palestine of yesteryear – take a look at this <u>YouTube video</u>, titled *East Palestine*, *Ohio*, "Movie Queen". It's a vintage film dating back to 1937 that was digitized. This unique footage offers a rare glimpse into our past and showcases the daily life, people, and charm of the village during its heyday.

The story behind the film is just as interesting as the footage itself. About ten years ago, **Kyle Anderson** discovered an old VHS tape tucked away in a box in his basement. The video, which had been transferred to YouTube, was originally passed down from his grandfather, **Fred Boies**, a lifelong East Palestine resident. It's believed the tape came from a friend of Fred's – possibly **Bill Davis**, who also serves as the narrator of the film.

The narration opens with a story that sets the scene:

"Back in 1937, the East Palestine Kiwanis Club was interested in helping the high school band and put on a benefit program. The purpose of the film was an advertising sales scheme to produce money for high school band uniforms."

Shot in the style of early silent films, this video offers a captivating window into village life. We'll be sharing snippets from this historic footage across our social media platforms in the weeks leading up to the celebration – so keep an eye out for familiar streets, buildings, and maybe even a few familiar last names.

It's a joy to look back and see East Palestine buzzing with activity, laughter, and community spirit – something we continue to cherish today. We hope you'll join us on July 12th to honor our past, celebrate the present, and look forward to the future.



This program has demonstrated remarkable growth, but with half of the team graduating this year, they are looking to recruit underclassmen to take on the (academic) challenge!


