Located at **15 South Market Street**, The Arctic Circle Shaved Ice and More has quickly become a vibrant addition to East Palestine's growing small-business community. This locally owned food service brings a refreshing mix of **shaved ice, Perry's Ice Cream, specialty drinks, freeze-dried treats, hot foods, and nostalgic candies**, offering residents and visitors a fun, flavorful stop right in the heart of town.

Known for its friendly service and creative menu, The Arctic Circle continues to expand their offerings to meet customer demand. 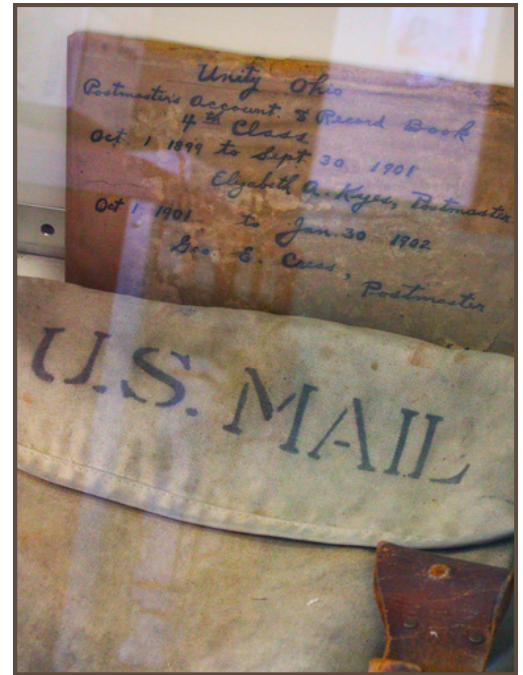


UNITED STATES POST OFFICE MURAL



During the Depression of 1934–1943, The Procurement Division of the United States Department of Treasury commissioned murals in post office buildings across the country as part of the New Deal. The objective was to secure artwork that met high artistic standards for public buildings, so art could be accessible to all people. These murals were intended to boost the morale of the American people suffering the effects from the Depression and ensured jobs during a time of people being out of work.

East Palestine's post office has one of these murals above the Postmaster's office—created by **Rolf Stoll** (born in 1892 in Heidelberg, Germany and passed away in Florida of 1978). Stoll moved to the United States in 1912, and painted the oil-on-canvas mural "Early East Palestine and Dr. Rhett Chamberlain's Post Office and Warehouse" for the post office in 1937. His artwork was sponsored by the Treasury Section of Fine Arts. Other of Stoll's work included landscapes, murals and watercolors, but he was prominently a portrait painter. He painted many distinguished Clevelanders and taught portrait painting at the school of art. Between 1925 and 1954, Stoll had 126 pieces of artwork accepted into the Cleveland Museum of Art's May Show and won many awards.



Did you know that Rolf Stoll was only documented to have painted **ONE** mural as a part of the New Deal? Our East Palestine post office is the only post office in the United States with one of Stoll's murals.

Preschool and Kindergarten Registration for the 2026–2027 School Year

Preschool and kindergarten registration for **NEW STUDENTS** for the 2026–2027 school year will open on Thursday, February 12, 2026. The Elementary and Preschool offices will be open February 12, from 10:00AM – 8:00PM. Beginning on February 17, both offices will be open for registration on school days from 10:00AM – 4:00PM.

This is an online registration with a follow up visit to the appropriate office to provide required documents in person. **There will be no packets distributed.** A student **MUST BE 5 years of age by September 8th, 2026**, to enroll in kindergarten.

****Please follow these steps to complete the enrollment process for NEW STUDENTS ONLY:**

1) If you are NEW to the district you will need to create an account. Please fill out all of the online registration documents by using the Final Forms link on the district webpage myepschools.org **(Do not complete online before 2/12/2026).**

2) Once all of the forms have been submitted online, please bring the following to the registration office- original/certified birth certificate, immunization records, proof of residency, parent/guardian driver's license or State ID, custody paperwork or court documents (if applicable), signed physician medical statement (for Preschool registration ONLY!)

Kindergarten Registration Office: E-9 Door located at **195 West Grant Street, East Palestine, OH 44413**

****Please follow this step if you have an EXISTING East Palestine Preschool Student**

If you have a preschooler going into preschool again or into kindergarten for the 2026–2027 school year, please go into your Final Forms account and update your child for next school year. Do not create a new account.

- Socialize with other adults

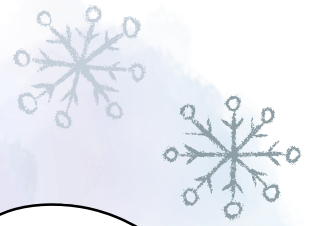
Available are Fitness challenges, featuring creativity and brain games. These are planned to be utilized when you get tired of walking or need a break.
