The Village of East Palestine is taking big steps towards fostering economic development and revitalization with the establishment of the Community Improvement Corporation (CIC). Authorized under the Ohio Revised Code, the CIC is a non-profit corporation which will serve as the driving force behind these crucial efforts.

Under Ohio law, villages can do development, but it's harder and slower for them to do so. The CIC exists to undertake these activities in a timely and business-like manner. And the CIC is especially built to negotiate deals and sign contracts with developers and businesses allowing it to swiftly respond to the evolving needs of the community. Its purpose is to work alongside the village to accomplish development goals and to spearhead transformative initiatives.

Abilities include but are not limited to:

- Entering into strategic economic development agreements with county or municipality.
- Borrow money for economic development projects through traditional means.
- Manage debt.
- Purchase or dispose of property.
- Operate a revolving loan fund for economic development projects.
- Serve as an agent for grant applications and administering grants.
- Make loans to any person, firm, partnership or corporation.

Formally registered with the State of Ohio, the CIC is in the process of securing a 501(c)(3) charitable non-profit designation from the IRS, further cementing its commitment to serving the public interest. Transparency and accountability are paramount to the CIC's operations. The corporation will hold public meetings and adhere to state audit requirements, ensuring that its actions remain aligned with the community's priorities and values. Through strategic partnerships, innovative initiatives, and a steadfast commitment to progress, the CIC aims to unlock the full potential of East Palestine. The goal is to create a vibrant and thriving community for generations to come.

This local tattoo shop is crafting up masterful custom designs. Bruce Riehl, owner of Bulldog Custom Tattooing has had a very diverse career path that brought him to opening his own shop. He worked as a mechanical engineer for 18 years and eventually shifted into real estate investing. This all changed when he purchased a house owned by a tattoo shop owner who encouraged him to take up tattooing after seeing his artwork. Bruce has always been artistic and enjoyed drawing as a hobby.

He decided to act on this passion and started a seven-month long apprenticeship at a tattoo shop here in East Palestine. His talents then took him to Wyld Chyld Tattoo in Pittsburgh to work under Ink Master's season 2 runner up, Sarah Miller. Bruce found his way back to East Palestine when he purchased the shop where his tattoo career began as an apprentice. The business expanded in 2016 to their current location managed by his wife Kay that houses eight stations and seven talented full-time artists.

"We really do have a good level of talent. Every artist is unique in their own way and has their own style. So, if you come to one artist with an idea and that artist doesn't feel comfortable with it, or if they think there's another artist in the shop that will do a better job, they're very quick to suggest that. I couldn't be prouder of our crew and the responses our customers give, once they have visited us. We continue to grow and look forward to meeting new clients!" says Riehl.
