
# Street and Utility Department

#### The EPA's Remediation Timeline for 2024

This Estimated Site Timeline was provided by the EPA and lists all the work that will be going on in relation to the derailment in the coming months. This schedule is an estimate and is subject to change based on several factors, including without limitation, obtaining required regulatory approvals, access, weather, equipment malfunction, receipt of laboratory results, etc.



#### **Sound the Alarm Campaign**

The American Red Cross will install FREE smoke alarms for residents who are living in housing without adequate working smoke alarms (one per each level of the home). Please pick up a form from the East Palestine Fire Department or the East Palestine Administration Building. Alarm installations will be scheduled beginning 4/20/24 and be completed by your local fire department, CERT or Red Cross volunteers. Residents must sign an agreement form.
