East Palestine Park - Phase 1 Update

Construction Expected to Start in July

At the April 8 East Palestine Village Council meeting, guest speakers Wendy Berrill, Director - Railway and Civil Design, Associate VP and Jason Wagner, Senior Civil Technical Specialist from Michael Baker International shared the revised park plan and explained Phase 1 initiatives. These include: relocation of sport courts and new stage, grading the oval and improving the field area to alleviate drainage issues, extending the parking areas along both sides of the main loop, and adding parking and lighting to the dog park area.

The Village Council confirmed that all the current courts will remain in place for play while the new ones are constructed in their new locations. After approvals, the plan is to start the bid process in May with the hopes to have selected a contractor and start construction in the park after the July 4th Celebration.

Help for Small Business

Multiple programs exist to help small businesses in and around East Palestine grow. The following is a summary of resources that can help.

Businesses needing a loan to fund the "gap" between what a bank will loan and project needs, can look to:

- Valley Ventures, a non-profit out of Youngstown, can provide several different loans, including SBA 504 loans and several revolving loan funds. Generally, rates are below market rates. Learn more at valleyedp.com.
- **OMEGA**, a regional council of governments offers revolving loan funds. Interest rates are generally below market and subordinate collateral requirements can help banks get comfortable with loans. Learn more at omegadistrict.org.
- The Small Business Administration (SBA) 7(a) Loan Guaranty is available through participating banks. Rates and terms are determined by the bank. The SBA guarantees a portion of the loan, allowing the bank to approve a loan it would not normally approve. Loan approval times can be expedited. Talk with your bank or go to sba.gov.

Businesses needing counseling or technical assistance also can get free or reduced cost access to services through:

- The Small Business Development Center (SBDC) out of Youngstown State and Kent State Universities offers free classes and can provide one-on-one counseling, including exporting assistance, procurement assistance and advice on business plans. Learn more a sbdc-ysu.org.
- The Youngstown Business Incubator can provide entrepreneurial support services and specializes in additive manufacturing, digital sales, and technology company development. Learn more at <u>vbi.org</u>.
- MAGNET can assist manufacturers with customized consulting services, talent development, and automation. Learn more at manufacturing success.org.
- Mahoning Valley Manufacturers **Coalition** can help with work force recruitment and development strategies. Learn more at mahoningvalleymfg.com.

- Children 8 years old or less and under four feet nine inches (4'9") in height, are prohibited from being a passenger.
